#### Course overview

The purpose of this course is to familiarize participants with econometric methods and models for empirical work in education economics. Topics include regression analysis, models for panel data, instrumental variables estimation, and regression discontinuity designs. Hands-on exercises using Stata focus on the human capital production function and the determinants of, and returns to schooling and vocational training.
